2. EDUCATING PROGRAMME :

We are so happy to report about the education programme of our children. They reported back for their first term of this year and are doing well. However some of the children were changed to different schools. Rashida and Teddy go to Siita nest primary school, Jonah and Tony go to Lutheran school just next to home of hope and the twins together with Maureen are in the same school in Entebbe for vocational school called Amaanyi empowerment centre. 3. THERAPY PROGRAMME –

In the month of February, a lot of emphasis was put on skills training and encouraging development of functional skills. A total of 06 children were assisted to learn to use their hands. It also involved engaging them in self-feeding sessions during meal times. A good number of children are progressing well with self-feeding. The therapist also had sessions where the major emphasis was put on using the non-functional hand. A good number of children attended the session and much progress was reported with grasping skills. The children who took part in these sessions can now reach out and grasp objects; however, they still have difficulties with release and coordination. We have registered one success this month of swabul learning how to feed himself and this has been due to the efforts of our dear therapist Eddy. Good job

4. DEVELOPING PROGRAMME

5. TRIPS/VISITS/OUTINGS –

In the month of February, Home of hope organised an outreach clinic on the 09/02/2018 during which the therapist was able to see a total of 12 clients for therapy and the parents were advised on proper therapy techniques to implement with their children from home.

Still on the 23/02/2018, the therapist together with the nurse and the social workers took part in another outreach clinic in Buwenge where a total number of 10 clients were seen for therapy and 50 for anti epileptic drugs. There was a low turn up of clients in Buwenge for therapy. This can be attributed to the fact that some clients cannot afford transport to and from the outreach clinic.

As Home of hope we organised one day per week to be visiting children with disabilities in the nearby community as our follow-up programme this has been a success.
